It will offer you a guide to music making with children for festival celebrations and give you a wealth of ideas and inspiration so that you can help children enter more deeply into these special times.

Traditionally music throughout the world has had a fundamental role in helping children celebrate and live in harmony with both seasonal and religious festivals. (e.g. The Chinese traditionally made music in different scales to attune them to each month of the year.)

Today, however, the celebration of the 'cycle of the year' through music has largely been lost (apart from singing Christmas carols). Having said this, people are increasingly realising that a root cause of our ecological crisis is the way that our industrial and technological society is distancing us from the 'RHYTHMS' OF NATURE and the 'TONE' OF THE SEASONS. (Fortunately many schools still create seasonal festivals - with music as a big part of them - which can be both life affirming and wonderful community celebrations.)

But there's more to creating music in the mood of the season than just singing songs with appropriate texts. (i.e. If you take the texts away can you hear the different tone of each season?)

On this course we will take as our starting point the question: what are the life forces of the plants doing at any particular time of the year - e.g. are they • breathing in, contracting and falling (Autumn and Winter)

• or breathing out, widening and rising (Spring and Summer)? When we attune to these forces then we can search for the corresponding elements in music.

So come and discover how different songs and instrumental pieces can give voice to the soundscape, tones and rhythms of different festivals:

the 8 'SEASONAL' festivals of Mid-winter, Imbolc, the Spring Equinox, Beltane, the Summer Solstice, Lammas, the Autumn Equinox and Samhain,

'RELIGIOUS' festivals such as Christmas, Easter, Ascension and Michaelmas.

The Festival Music you will Sing and Play

This course will introduce you to a rich treasure-trove of seasonal songs that all children will cherish, including:

- NEW CHILDREN'S MUSIC CREATED ESPECIALLY FOR FESTIVALS (e.g. by Michael Deason-Barrow and Pär Ahlbom)
 - Magical New Seasonal/Festival Rounds
- FESTIVAL MUSIC FROM AROUND THE WORLD (e.g. from Zimbabwe and Japan)
- SONGS OF SEASON AND CEREMONY FROM ENGLISH & CELTIC FOLK TRADITIONS (e.g. from John Barleycorn and Jack in the Green to Wassail Songs)

How to Awaken the Mood of each Season through Music

This course will explore with you how you can use specific

• INSTRUMENTS • SCALES • KEYS • INTERVALS • RHYTHMS AND • HARMONIES, etc. in connection with different festivals.

e.g. In particular, we will explore with you

- the relationship between seasons and the moods of different modes (scales) from: the rising light-filled Lydian Mode (Midsummer) → the Autumnal Aeolian Mode → the balance of light and dark found in the Dorian Mode (Spring Equinox)
- how intervals can have an inner/dark aspect and an outer/light aspect
- how different metres and rhythms work with levity and gravity
- how melodies and harmonies can either be bare and still or lush and blossoming

Instruments for Festival Celebrations

Come and discover

- i) new ideas for how different instruments can be associated with specific festivals (e.g. the use of iron instruments for Michaelmas and bronze ones for the Summer Solstice);
 - ii) how nature's instruments (e.g. stones and seeds) can be used and
- iii) how the 4 elements (earth, air, fire and water) can be sounded and linked to each season.

Improvise and Create Seasonal Soundscapes for Festivals

Explore how you can IMPROVISE and COMPOSE MUSIC WITH CHILDREN in the mood of each season (using the above elements). Also discover how you can help children become more aware of their soundscape by creating music inspired by particular landscapes. Such soundscape compositions can then be played outside so that the children simultaneously hear the conversation between nature and music.
