# The Story of the Carol

This workshop will tell
the STORY of CAROLS through the AGES
in an amazing diversity of
CULTURES and PLACES.

It will take you on

a JOURNEY with a BREATH-TAKING SCOPE and will conjure forth the Christmas Spirit of each age from

- Ancient Pagan & Folk Traditions
  - → Medieval Monasteries
- →• Renaissance and Baroque glories
- → the world of Dickens' 'Christmas Carol'
- → Contemporary Carols which sing of New Mysteries.

#### Along the way you'll meet:

- i) whole genres of carols that have been unjustly neglected and which are full of different harmonies, intervals, scales and rhythms (e.g. Village, West Gallery, Multi-cultural and Modern carols).
- ii) captivating stories of wassailers, waites, dissenters, gnostics & mystery plays; carols with magical names like 'Old Foster', and figures such as St. Francis of Assisi and Laurie Lee
- iii) how the pagan origins of the carol with its attendant folk rituals became entangled with and assimilated into the church (as well as banned from it!).
- iv) fascinating tales of how: `Good King Wenceslas' was originally a Spring Carol, the tune of `O Little Town of Bethlehem' was sung to `The Ploughboy's Dream', how `O, Come All Ye Faithful' contained a coded Jacobite message, and how a Christmas carol "with roots in the hop fields of Kent ended up as the unofficial National Anthem of Yorkshire" (Gant)

#### N.B.

Michael will give illuminating INTROS to each period of the carol's history accompanied by GUIDED LISTENING to stunning carols from each age (all delivered with expert knowledge, musicality and not a little humour).

Then for each theme we will SING alorious examples of this music.

## Carols through the Ages

This workshop will begin by conjuring forth the spirit of ancient ceremonies from

#### • ANGLO-SAXON times

when carols were sung in the fields, not indoors sitting on pews.

Here you'll meet and sing

earthy, exuberant and dancing carols full of rollicking rhythms, from the stomping rhythms of Carmina Burana to dance the snow off our boots, to a Norse fertility rite. No monasteries or sentimentality here!

We'll even DANCE a few of them (led by Lorin Panny).

We'll then move on to:

· MEDIEVAL Carols

from medieval monks singing a sublime Christmas Gregorian Chant accompanied by bells to the Waites singing a carol from a Medieval Mystery Play.

#### · ENGLISH FOLK & VILLAGE traditions

including • Ritual folk songs with their origins in mythic and Gnostic sources, (from the Cherry Tree Carol to the ancient ritual of Wassailing)

- the WEST GALLERY voicings so beloved of Thomas Hardy where you'll have the chance to take the plaster off the ceiling with your voices.
  - a HEBRIDEAN Carol that evokes a gently rocking seascape
  - & a unique IRISH Carol tradition which was sung in the winter fields.

which sing of New Mysteries and New Listening by composers such as John Taverner and Dietmar Liebsch.

So come and join in with all these companies of singers and experience the special mid-winter worlds they each create.
